



Notice to LLQP Students

The harmonized LLQP provincial examination has been in effect since January 1, 2016 with over 550 examinations written to date in Manitoba.

Examinations are [currently marked](#) in two different methods: *Compensatory* and *Modular*. The Compensatory option allows the applicant to have their exam modules marked separately with the overall mark being based on the modules as a whole. **This method of marking will be withdrawn as of November 7, 2016.** Effective November 8, 2016 and thereafter, examinations will only be marked on a Modular basis. Modular exam marking requires each exam module to be marked individually and the candidate must obtain a minimum of 60% on each module. Should the candidate fail one or more modules, that/those individual module(s) must be re-written and the candidate must successfully complete each module with a minimum of 60% in order to move forward with applying for a licence.

The Rewrite Rules remain unchanged and are as follows:

- Students can write the new exam 3 times before there is any waiting period.
- There will be a waiting period of 3 months after the third attempt (measured from the date of the 3rd attempt)
- There will be a waiting period of 3 months after the fourth attempt (measured from the date of the 4th attempt)
- There will be a waiting period of 6 months after any subsequent attempt (measured from the date of the latest attempt)
